DUNN HOUSE

Welcome to Dunn House.

Dunn House is our home away from home for Grade 1 to 7 boys.

Our aim at Dunn House is to create a homely atmosphere in a structured and loving environment. Please see us as an extension to your family and feel free to contact us or pop in whenever possible and necessary.



Please take note of this information that will help you settle in and make yourself at home. Please also note this information can change from time to time and boys will be informed accordingly at school.

BEDDING

Boys must bring their own sheets, pillow/s, pillowcases, and a duvet with 2 covers. Blankets are a necessity in winter. All items **MUST** be marked clearly.

CELL PHONES

Boys are not permitted to keep their cell phones with them. They will be kept in safe-keeping and given to them daily from 17h00 until supper starts. On occasion, at the discretion of the house parents, boys will be allowed their phones outside of this time. The school will not be held responsible for any loss of phones. Should you need to contact your son urgently, you are welcome to contact the house parents.

CHAPEL

School life is centered around our Chapel. All boys are expected to attend chapel each morning at school and on Sunday at 09:00 in Full School Uniform. Sunday morning services are compulsory.

CIVVIES

No civvies may be worn on the campus. Full school uniform is to be worn when travelling to travel to and from school on leave out weekends, going out and returning with friends or family, leaving, and returning to the campus at any time, going to church, going to town and any formal function. Full School uniform is worn to school in the 2nd and 3rd terms.

COMMON ROOM

The Common room is a space where the boys can relax, play indoor games, and have fun! There are also 2 Computers available for the boys to do Projects on. Please send with 1 x Memory stick

COURTESY AND MANNERS

Boys are expected to deport themselves in a gentlemanly manner. The customary greetings are very much a part of our school tradition. (Boys are expected to stand when an adult enters a room and greet them with respect and courtesy etc.)

COVERING OF BOOKS

Each grade has different requirements. Should your son not be going home in the first couple of weeks of the first term, please supply all the necessary – brown paper/coloured paper, ready-cut book covers and plastic A4 and A5, sellotape, DC-fix (sticky plastic), labels, etc. and we will assist him to get his books correctly covered according to the teacher's specifications. If this applies to your son, please chat to the house parents about it.

CUPBOARDS

Each boy has a double door cupboard for which he must supply a padlock.

Hangers are necessary for the hanging of clothing, to keep a neat and tidy room. We ask that belongings be removed from the cupboards during the holidays, for cleaning and possibly other visiting learners staying in our hostels for tours. Belongings may be packed into a suitcase or trunk, which is stored in a storeroom. It is easier to keep a check on the uniform if clothes are taken home every holiday.

DELIVERIES TO LEARNER

DISCIPLINE

Boys are encouraged to be polite and courteous and treat others, and the property of others, with respect at all times. If parents support the school's discipline structures within the hostel as well, the boys feel more secure and will be happier.

Please be assured that any rules and routines in the hostel are there for your son's benefit as well as for the benefit of the other boys. Please feel free to chat to the house parents should you have any questions in this regard.

EXTRA MURALS

Boys are encouraged to participate in as many extra murals as possible – as it allows them to settle in, make friends and experience all that the school has to offer. The extra murals on offer and times will be communicated to the boys each term. A full list is available in the School Parent Handbook.

FUNCTIONS

The more functions you attend and are involved with your son, the school, other parents, and the staff, the sooner you will feel part of "the St Andrew's Family" and have a better understanding of how the school runs. We encourage you to engage with others in the St Andrew's Family as much as possible. We (and your son) would love to see you at various functions and occasions at the school.

A few of the functions you are welcome to attend include Sunday morning chapel, Evensong services, sports events, derby days, parent meetings, parent social events, gala's, athletics, and others. Invitations will be sent out but keep an eye on our Facebook and Instagram pages too!

GOING TO TOWN

Boys may be allowed to leave the school campus e.g. go to the doctor or visit a relative, provided that:

1. It has been discussed and permission granted by the house parents
2. He is accompanied by an adult
3. He always signs out and back in on return to the hostel.

All boys leaving the school campus for other than a sports practice must be in full school uniform (blazer, tie, bashers).

HOMEWORK AND PREP

The boys who are not playing sport or involved in extra-mural activities attend homework after school. Homework takes place at the hostel in the Prep Room. Homework is supervised there, but any homework or extra work such as finishing a project or practicing an oral will be done during prep time.

LEAVE-OUT WEEKENDS

An official leave-out weekend is scheduled each term and school closes at **10:30** on the first day of the leave-out weekend. There will be **NO** sport on that afternoon (unless league fixtures must be played). Depending on school activities, learners may go home every weekend.

LOCKS

One padlock with two keys, must be provided for locking cupboards.

LUGGAGE

Any tog bags, suitcases that are left at the hostel, **MUST** be very clearly marked. Your son will also need the official Saints' tog bag (can be purchased at Kloppers) and a school suitcase - normal 7 division – **NO** soft cover back packs please. For the senior grades, hockey stick bags and cricket equipment bags are useful to keep everything together.

MONEY MATTERS

Money for the tuck shop and any other small expenses boys might have, should be handed to Mrs. Meyer for safekeeping. A strict record of any money issued will be kept. The Fetta's tuck shop operates on a card system as well and boys, grade 5 upwards have the option, at the parent's discretion, of using a bank card instead.

PARENT COMMUNICATION

Letters and notices are sent to the parents via WhatsApp or e-mail. Please ensure you provide a valid email address to the school.

PARENT TEACHER CONTACT

If you need to see a teacher, please arrange an interview directly with the teacher concerned. (This will only start after the first leave-out weekend).

TUCK

This must be stored in a tuck box which is kept inside your son's cupboard. Please pack healthy snacks as far as possible. Young boys tend to not eat properly at meals if they have eaten too many snacks during the day. Suggestions of tuck for boys - energy bars, biscuits, biltong, dry wors, chips, 2-minute noodles, pretzels, dried fruit and limited amount of sweets and chocolates.

REGISTRATION FORM

This must be completed accurately. It is **VERY** important to have the correct details of both parents and your son. These will be used to contact parents when necessary and for the Boarder Parent Representatives to invite you to functions. This information **MUST** please be kept updated.

ROOMS

There are four beds in a room.

Each boy has his own desk, bookshelf, and chair and curtains are provided in all hostel rooms.

No heaters, toasters, kettles, or electric blankets are allowed or any other electrical equipment.

Posters and plants are allowed with the House Master's approval. Care must be taken not to damage the walls and other surfaces.

If your son has a toy, books, or a game he would like to bring to the hostel, please chat to the house parents about it. We want your son to be happy and feel that this is his 2nd home, but we don't want him to be distraught if something special is damaged or is lost. If any personal items are damaged or stolen the school cannot and will not be held responsible. Please bring a bedside-mat as carpeting is not provided.

SANATORIUM

Sister sees the boys before breakfast, before lunch and before supper on weekdays. On Saturdays and Sundays Sister Annerika is at the San before breakfast and supper, but she is on call 24/7 if needed in an emergency. If necessary, boys stay in the San. Parents will also be contacted should the need arise. Medical Aid information must be up-to-date with the house parents and office.

Should your child be on medication, please visit the Sanatorium on the first day to meet the Sister, who will keep all medication and administer when necessary. **NO medication, including vitamins maybe kept in the boy's rooms.** Only emergency medication, such as an asthma pump or bee sting medication maybe kept in the boy's room.

SCHOOL ACCIDENT INSURANCE POLICY

Medical Aid Insurance is automatically provided to all learners.

SCHOOL HOUSES

Saints has four schoolhouses - Clegg (blue), Mackenzie (red) and Champion (yellow) and a hostel house (green) (for grades 8-12). All Dunn House learners are in Clegg house (blue). Learners compete in sports as well as cultural and service activities earning points to determine the winner.

SCHOOL MAGAZINE

Our annual magazine is distributed at the end of the year and is purchased via the Karri App.

SPORT

Sport is compulsory for all boys except those with a doctor's note. Afternoon "out of dorms" is to encourage boys to be active in the afternoons.

STATIONERY

Please see list applicable to your son's grade that is supplied by the school. Text and exercise books (including hard cover books) are supplied by the school at no extra cost

THEFT

Your son is responsible for looking after his own possessions. Encourage responsibility. We take the theft of another boy's items very seriously. Perpetrators will be dealt with as per the Disciplinary Code of Conduct.

TOILETRIES

Supply own toilet bag and toiletries.

UNIFORM

Marking of Clothes

Please note the importance of having **ALL** items clearly marked with printed name tapes firmly sewn into place. All articles of clothing including towels must be marked with name tapes or indelible marker where possible. Loss of clothing is caused mainly by bad marking and pupils leaving their clothes lying around. If clothes are bought in Bloemfontein at the beginning of term, they **MUST** be marked before leaving them at school with your son.

Shoes and sports equipment must also be marked.

Clothing Suppliers

Kloppers at Loch Logan Waterfront is the official supplier of St Andrew's Uniform. You can open an account for ease of use for your son. The second-hand shop at Saints holds various lines of new and second-hand clothing (see list below).

Please ensure that your sons bring home their clothing during the holidays for repairs to buttons, tears, holes, splits, and the like.

ALL UNMARKED LOST PROPERTY WILL BE TAKEN TO THE SECOND-HAND SHOP AND SOLD.

Please take note of this information that will help you settle in and make yourself at home. Please also note this information can change from time to time and boys will be informed accordingly at school.

BEDDING

Boys must bring their own sheets, pillow/s, pillowcases, and a duvet. Blankets are a necessity in winter. All items **MUST** be marked clearly.

CELL PHONES

The school will not be held responsible for the loss of any phones. We do find it is not a good idea to phone your son before the first leave-out! Remember your son "unloads" on you and then goes off to do something and leaves you feeling terrible.

CHAPEL

School life is centred around our Chapel. All boys are expected to attend chapel each morning at 07:30 before school and on Sunday at 09:00 in Full School Uniform.

Sunday morning services are compulsory. Confirmation Service is held annually and is voluntary for boys in Grade 10/11/12.

CLEANING AGENTS

The boys must from time-to-time help clean the hostels and their own room and require cleaning agents to do the job properly! Suggestions: A broom (a must), a bucket (a must) which will double as a dustbin. Dusters or super-wipes. A little broom and dustpan (a must). Each boy must have a shoe polish kit to clean his shoes.

COMMON ROOM

Common rooms are equipped with TV, Pool table, table-tennis table, WIFI and DSTV and well used by the boys in their 'downtime'. We encourage interaction and fun!

COMPUTERS

It is recommended that each boarder has his own Laptop.

COVERING OF BOOKS

Please supply all the necessary – brown paper/coloured paper, ready-cut book covers and plastic A4 and A5, sellotape, plastic, labels, etc. Books need to be covered in the first couple of weeks of school. More details are given by the teachers on the first day.

GOING TO TOWN

Boys may be allowed to go to town during the week for emergencies/essentials with the permission of the House Master/staff member on duty. All boys must be in **full school uniform** with bashers and must have permission from staff on duty and sign out. Boys must sign in on return.

LEARNER COMMUNICATION

Cell phones are allowed. They must be off during school, chapel, or any school event.

LEAVE-OUT WEEKENDS

One official leave-out weekend is allocated per term. School closes at **10:30** on first day of the leave-out weekend. There will be **NO** sport on that afternoon (unless league fixtures must be played).

Special dispensations may be made to include Friday as well. Optional out weekends are allowed. Depending on school activities, learners may go home every weekend.

A parental consent form must be filled in by all parents for each son in the hostels.

LOCKS

2 padlocks must be provided, 1 for the cupboard and the other for the door to the room. We suggest a good quality combination locks.

LUGGAGE

Three suitcases which fit into one another on wheels are ideal. The Official Saints tog bag is also necessary – buy it from the school uniform suppliers – Klopers. A school suitcase - normal 7 division – NO soft cover back packs! Hockey stick bags and cricket equipment bags are useful to keep everything together!! **ALL these items MUST be very well marked.**

MILK

Milk is ordered at the beginning of term and is charged onto the School Fees Account.

MONEY FOR CONTINGENCIES

Your son will need money for small extra's like entrepreneur's day, tuck shop, civvies day's etc. It is safest to pay the money into your son's bank account so that he can pay the school.

PARENT COMMUNICATION

Letters and notices are sent to the parents via email; please ensure you provide a valid email address to the school. Email to the boys is available. If parcels are sent to the boys by courier, use the street address (Dan Pienaar Drive, Westdene).

PARENT TEACHER CONTACT

If you need to see a teacher, please arrange an interview directly with the teacher concerned. (Teacher email addresses are available on the School Parent Handbook and from the office)

PREP

Senior Hostels have prep in their rooms with the door open. There are 3 prep sessions per night and extra prep is permissible. No music is allowed, and cell phones **MUST** be OFF and locked away. The phones will be confiscated if found. There is normal prep on Friday nights and 2 preps after Chapel on Sunday nights.

REGISTRATION FORM

This must be completed accurately. It is VERY important to have the correct details of both parents and your son. These will be used to contact parents when necessary and for the Boarder Parent Representatives to invite you to functions. This information MUST be kept updated.

ROOMS

Rooms in each hostel are the same size but the number of boys change as they get older.

Senior School: 2 learners per room

Each matric boy has their own room.

Each boy has his own desk, bookshelf, and chair.

No heaters, toasters, kettles, or electric blankets are allowed or any other electrical equipment. Each hostel has a kitchenette equipped with a toaster, Hydro-boil (Instant boiling water), microwave and a 5-stage commercial water filtration system.

If any personal items are damaged or stolen the school cannot and will not be held responsible.

It is advisable to send computers/laptops to hostel for learners to use for schoolwork.

Posters and plants are allowed with the House Master's approval.

Care must be taken not to damage the walls and other surfaces.

Curtains are provided for the hostel rooms.

Please bring a bedside-mat as carpeting is not provided.

SAN HOURS

Sister sees the boys before breakfast, before lunch and before supper. If necessary, they stay in the San. Parents will be contacted if the need arises. Medical Aid information must be readily available.

SCHOOL ACCIDENT POLICY

Medical aid Insurance is strongly recommended. An Indemnity and Medical Details Form (Sanatorium Form) must also be filled in and returned to the school.

SCHOOL HOUSES

All hostel boys from Grade 8-12 come together as the boarding house when it comes to inter-house competition. Boys will be in a tutor group and parents are encouraged to get to know their son's tutor (staff member). The tutor group is a vertical mentoring system with boys from across the different grades making up the tutor group.

SCHOOL MAGAZINE

Our annual magazine is distributed at the end of the year and is purchased via the Karri App.

SLEEPING BAG

This is used often – Derby Day trips, camps, weekend outings, etc. Must be marked.

SPORT

Sport is compulsory for all boys except those with a doctor's note. Afternoon "out of dorms" is to encourage boys to be active in the afternoons.

STATIONERY

Must be supplied – usual things. Maths Set and calculator will be specified. Text and exercise books (including hard cover books) are supplied by the school and included in the school fees.

TABLE TUCK

Table tuck is shared with the table and stored in the dining-room. Boys are asked to contribute 1 or 2 items per term. The boys usually decide who brings what. Suggestions: peanut butter, mayonnaise, chutney, salt and vinegar seasoning, cheese-spread, tomato sauce, marmite, bovril, chilli sauce – your son's favourite!

THEFT

Your son is responsible for looking after his own possessions. Encourage responsibility. We take the theft of other boy's items seriously and will deal with the boys as per the Disciplinary Code of Conduct.

TOILETRIES

Supply own toilet bag and toiletries. These can be bought at Mimosa Mall. If accounts are opened for pupils, orders can be placed at the San.

TUCK

This must be stored in a tuck box which is kept inside your cupboards. Suggestions of tuck for boys (who are always hungry) - condensed milk, sweets, biscuits, chocolates, mixed cordial, biltong, dry wors, chips, 2-minute noodles, energy bars, fruit and nuts, pretzels, milo, coffee, sugar, cremora, cappuccino sachets, etc. Fetta's Tuck Shop is open during school hours and operates on a card system.

UNIFORM

Saints Shop

There is a uniform on the premises which sells second hand uniform, memorabilia, supporter wear, sports house shirts and other uniform. Opening hours change each term and are advertised on the electronic notice boards and in parent communication.

Marking of Clothes

Please note the importance of having **ALL** items clearly marked with printed name tapes firmly sewn into place. All articles of clothing including towels and hatbands must be marked with name tapes or indelible marker where possible. Loss of clothing is caused mainly by bad marking and pupils leaving their clothes lying around. If clothes are bought in Bloemfontein at the beginning of term, they **MUST** be marked before leaving them at school with your son.

Shoes and sports equipment must also be marked.

Clothing Suppliers

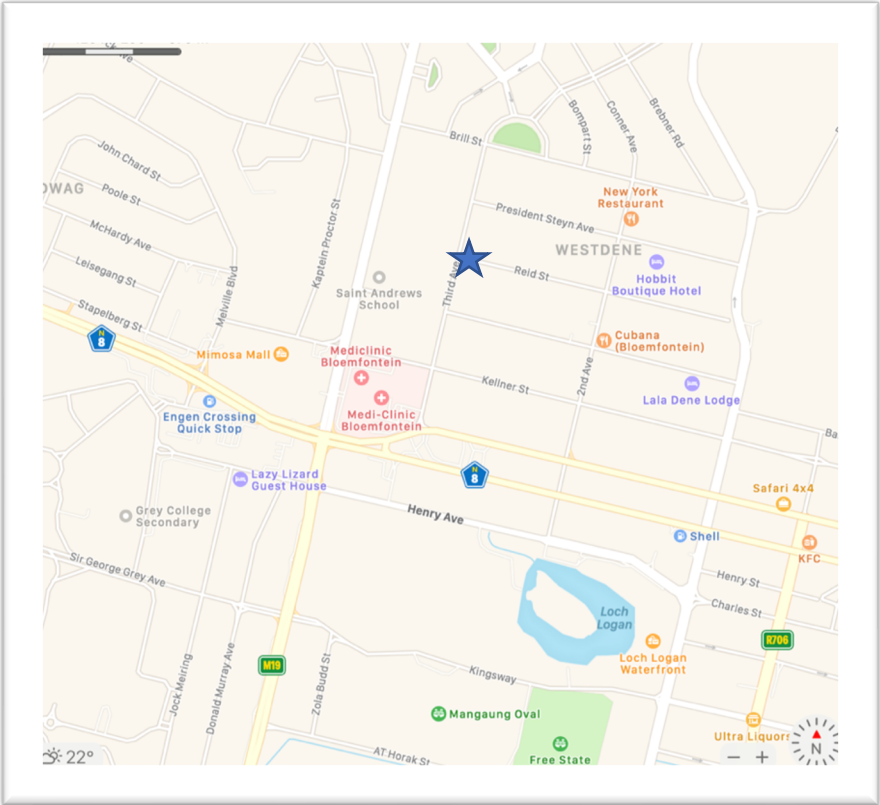

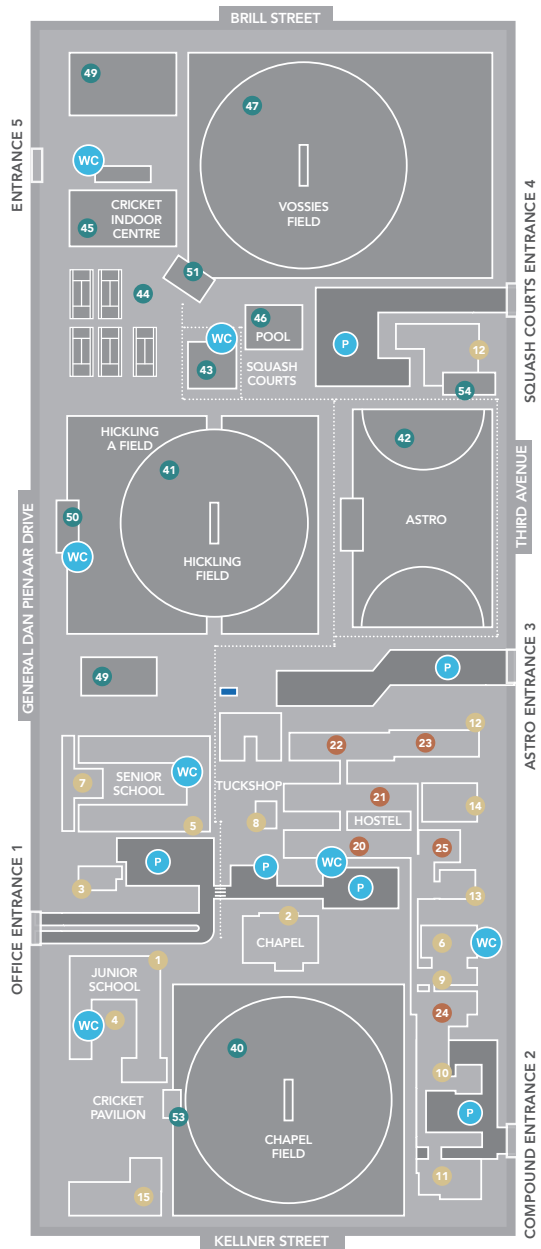
MAP OF SCHOOL LOCATION

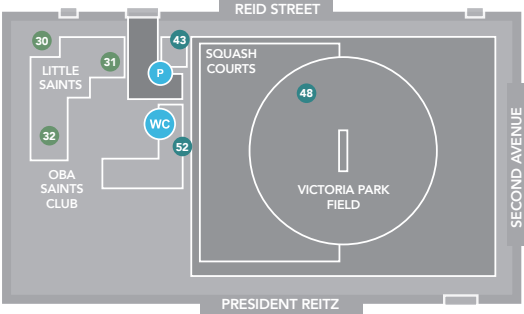
